# as Visiting Professor

Professor Ross has been <u>appointed as a</u> <u>visiting associate professor for the 2024-</u> <u>2025 academic year</u>. She is a reproductive justice and human rights activist who has reframed reproductive rights within the broader context of human rights. A 2022 recipient of the MacArthur Foundation "genius" award, she currently serves as an associate professor in the Program for the Study of Women and Gender at Smith College.

Professor Ross will be presenting guest lectures and seminars, mentoring students, providing training for faculty that enhances their understanding on best practices for defining and implementing an inclusive, respectful work and learning environment, and working with the YSN faculty to design curriculum modules on human rights and social justice.


